It recognizes Professor Mike Horsley's contribution to the formation of Commerce, Economics, Business Studies and Legal Studies student teachers through his work as a teacher educator and to the professional development of beginning Commerce, Economics, Business Studies and Legal Studies teachers through Economics and Business Educators NSW.

The Economics and Business Educators Professor Mike Horsley Beginning Teachers Rural Professional Learning Grant will be awarded to one teacher in rural NSW for the "Teaching the HSC Course (Year 12) in Business Studies for the First Time?" course.
