Economics and Business Educators Professor Mike Horsley Beginning Teachers Rural Professional Learning Grant

The Economics and Business Educators Professor Mike Horsley Beginning Teachers Rural Professional Learning Grant is named after the late Professor Mike Horsley who is a past president of Economics and Business Educators NSW. It recognizes Professor Mike Horsley's contribution to the formation of Commerce, Economics, Business Studies and Legal Studies student teachers through his work as a teacher educator and to the professional development of beginning Commerce, Economics, Business Studies and Legal Studies teachers through his work as an Economics and Business Educators NSW president and director.

The Economics and Business Educators Professor Mike Horsley Beginning Teachers Rural Professional Learning Grant will be awarded to one teacher in rural NSW for the "Teaching Commerce for the first time?" course. The successful applicant will receive complimentary entry to the course, and can claim up to \$750 travel and accommodation expenses (accommodation expenses will be reimbursed for one night only).

The grant will be open to people who are:

- Secondary school teachers.
- Teaching Commerce in 2021.
- Currently employed in a NSW government or non-government school.
- Teaching in a school that is located a distance greater than 200 km from the venue (calculated by Google Maps).
- Current financial members of EBE NSW.

Applicants for the grant will need to email EBE NSW (admin@ebe.nsw.edu.au) a statement of approximately 600 words describing the expected benefits and learning to be gained by attending the conference and networking with other teachers, and how those learnings will be shared with teachers from your school and region. Applicants should also indicate their willingness to write a comprehensive report about the conference for "The EBE Journal – Journal of the Economics and Business Educators NSW".



The applications will be judged on the following set of criteria:

- The content in the applicant's statement describing the expected benefits and learnings to be gained by attending the conference and networking with other teachers and how those learnings will be shared with teachers from your school and region.
- Willingness to write an article on the conference for "The EBE Journal - Journal of the Economics and Business Educators NSW " (minimum length: 2 A4 pages)

Conditions:

The successful applicant:

1. Will receive complimentary entry to the course.
2. Will submit an invoice after the conference for the value up to \$750 for travel and accommodation (accommodation expenses will be reimbursed for one night only).
3. Understands the invoice for expenses will be paid by EBE NSW.
4. Will have their name and school publicised by EBE NSW.
5. Will write a 2 A4 page article based on the conference for the "The EBE Journal - Journal of the Economics and Business Educators NSW".
